Use near someone who can check on you

Make sure someone is around to administer naloxone/Narcan if you overdose. **Never Use Alone Hotline 800-484-3731**



2

Have naloxone nearby

Know the signs of an overdose. Be sure you, your friends, and family carry naloxone/Narcan. Click here for more information on naloxone.

Call 911 first if there is an overdose

3

911 will instruct you on how to support the person's breathing. Stay with them until emergency personnel arrive.

The Good Samaritan Law

When calling 911, the Good Samaritan Law provides certain legal protection, whether you have drugs with you or not.

4

Practice harm reduction strategies

There are steps you can take to reduce your risk of overdose. Start with smaller amounts. Test drugs with strips for safety. Consider smoking/snorting over injecting. Use new syringes and seek care for wounds.
